Class: 1/2			Title: The invention of the radio	
<b>Topic summary:</b> The invention of the radio was one of the most important and <u>influential</u> technological breakthroughs of the early 20 <sup>th</sup> century. Many scientists were involved in discoveries that led to the invention of the radio. An Italian, Guglielmo Marconi, is often called the inventor of the radio. Marconi built the first wireless telegraph, which sent messages through the air for the first time. On 12 <sup>th</sup> December 1901, Marconi successfully received a message sent across the Atlantic from Cornwall in England to Newfoundland in Canada.
