Class: 2				Title: Florence Nightingale			
<p>Topic summary: Florence Nightingale dedicated her life to nursing. She travelled to Crimea in the 1850s where there was a war taking place. She was shocked to find that, any soldiers were wounded and that the poor, <u>insanitary</u> conditions were the cause of many children dying. She is <u>significant</u> in history because she <u>improved</u> the <u>conditions</u> for soldiers by training nurses and showing them how to prevent infections. This made nursing a profession and that is her <u>legacy</u>. Because she was known to carry an oil lamp when she checked the soldiers at night, she is often called, ‘The Lady with the Lamp’.</p>
