These are the details of the September 2022 allocation of Secondary School places in Newcastle. This information was not available at the time of our Consultation Report but sadly it shows that the situation faced by children of the Inner West is <u>even worse</u> than it was this time last year.

- 1. Last year, the chance of an Inner West parent being allocated a place in an unrequested school was just over twice as likely as a parent living elsewhere in the city (11% to 5%); now it is three and a half times more likely (14% to 4%)
- 2. There are more children from the Inner West being allocated places in unrequested schools than the rest of the city put together (122 compared to 71, a difference of 51) and that differential has increased more than EIGHT FOLD in one year (from 94 to 88 in 2021, a difference of 6)
