Question

My child is happy at St Paul's

100% of parents/carers reported that their child was happy at school. Our aim is that all children feel valued and happy at school. We are pleased with this response and we will conduct further surveys and pupil interviews to ensure that we can gain a deeper understanding on how we can continue to ensure that children are happy at our school.

Question

My child feels safe at St Paul's

100% of parents/carers reported that their child feels safe at school. Safeguarding is such an important area and all children should feel safe at school. We will continue to seek children's views in discussions with them to ensure that they are able to share and concerns about feeling safe that they may have. If you have any concerns in this important area, please speak to a senior member of staff.

Question

My child is taught well at St Paul's

99% of parents/carers reported that their child is taught well at school. We are disappointed to see that not all parents/carers feel their child is taught well. Information regarding the school curriculum is available on the school website and parents/carers are able to discuss any concerns with senior members of staff.

Question

My child makes good progress at St Pauls

100% of parents/carers reported that their child makes good progress at school. This is pleasing to see. We ensure that we have a clear intention for each subject area and that we use a broad range of assessment techniques to ensure that all children make good progress. Progress of children is shared between class teachers, subject leaders and senior leaders to ensure that children continue to make good progress.

Question

I receive valuable information about my child's progress

98% of parents/carers reported that they receive information about their child's progress at school. We are disappointed to see that not all parents/carers feel that they receive enough information regarding the progress that their child is making. We have biannual parents evening which gives parents/ carers an extended opportunity to discuss with their child's teacher and we provide a written report annually. Parents/ carers are encouraged to contact their child's class teachers if they feel that they require further information. Parents/carers can also contact senior members of staff to discuss any matter regarding their child.

Question

My child receives appropriate homework for their age

96% of parents/ carers feel that children receives appropriate homework for their age. 4% of parents/ carers do not feel that their child receives appropriate homework. As a school, we have invested in the Mirodo and SATS Companion platforms to provide homework for children in Key Stage Two. Homework tasks are set by the class teachers and reflect the current work being completed in task. In Key Stage One children receive homework on the OneNote platform, these tasks also reflect the work that the children complete at school to provide them with consolidation and extension tasks

Our response: Behaviour

Question

St Paul's ensures that children are well behaved

100% of parents report that the school ensures that children are well behaved. Our Learning Behaviours Policy is well embedded throughout the school. Children understand the values of the school and they are able to explain the Secrets to Success to help them focus upon developing successful behaviours for learning. We continue to reward

Question

The school deals well with bullying

95% of parents/ carers feel that the school deals well with bullying. If you do have any concerns regarding bullying, please come and speak to a member of the senior staff. The school takes any form of bullying seriously and will take immediate steps to address this.



Our response: Leadership

Question

The school responds well to any concerns that I raise

100% of parents/ carers feel that the school responds well to any concerns that they raise. As a school, we want to deal with any concerns that satisfy all concerned.

Question

The school dealt with my concerns quickly and properly

85% of parents and carers felt that the school dealt with an issue that they have raised both quickly and properly. As a school, we aim to resolve all concerns in a prompt manner. We recognise that not everyone will be happy with decisions that are made regarding concerns involving their children. To ensure that we resolve concerns promptly, we follow protocols and procedures to ensure that we are able to provide support and stability.

Our response: SEND

29% (4) of responses came from parents/ carers of children with SEND. These questions were asked specifically to these parents and carers.

Question

The school gives my child the support they need to succeed

100% of responses indicated that their children received the support that they needed to succeed. We have created a curriculum that is scaffolded to enable all children to be able to access learning and make progress. Our inclusive ethos means that we apply a range of strategies to ensure that children with SEND are able to access the support that need to succeed at school. We are pleased that the parents/ carers feel that these strategies are successful.

Question

The school has high expectations for my child(ren)

100% of parents/carers strongly agree that the school has high expectations for their child. This again reflects the inclusive ethos of the school. We have a clear Intent for all subject areas and we ensure that learning has a clear scaffold to ensure that all children are able to access learning and that they are able to progress in their development of knowledge, skills and understanding.
